Executive Director's Message

2024 marked another year of growth and innovation for PVJOBS as we expanded opportunities for youth, strengthening workforce development programs while investing in the long-term sustainability of our organization and community.

Throughout the year, PVJOBS secured several significant funding awards and program partnerships that allowed us to deepen our impact across Los Angeles County. We were honored to receive a new \$1.5 million YouthBuild grant from the U.S. Department of Labor, enabling us to provide construction and media career pathways for youth ages 16-24 over the next three years. Additionally, we expanded our work with justice-involved youth through a new partnership with the Los Angeles County Probation Department, delivering construction pre-apprenticeship training at Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall and Camp Kilpatrick.

PVJOBS also continued to strengthen educational partnerships through a new contract with the Los Angeles Unified School District to provide after-school construction pre-apprenticeship training at Cal Burke High School in Panorama City. These programs ensure that young people gain exposure to career opportunities, industry-recognized training, and pathways to economic mobility before entering the workforce.

Beyond workforce development, we continued to invest in our facilities and future growth. Through a partnership with Tesla and the City of Los Angeles, PVJOBS was selected to receive eight electric vehicle charging stations at our South Los Angeles headquarters, further expanding community resources and supporting environmental sustainability efforts.

As always, our work is made possible through the dedication of our staff, board members, participants, employers, funders, and community partners. Together, we continue to create opportunities, strengthen families, and build pathways to brighter futures for the communities we serve.



PVJOBS SECURES NEW YOUTHBUILD AND YOUTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

PVJOBS continued its commitment to providing life-changing opportunities for young people by securing a new \$1.5 million YouthBuild grant from the U.S. Department of Labor. The grant will serve 64 youth ages 16 through 24 over a three-year period, providing comprehensive training in construction and media career pathways while supporting education, leadership development, and long-term career success.

Building upon this achievement, PVJOBS expanded services for youth throughout Los Angeles County through a new contract with the Los Angeles Unified School District. Through this partnership, the organization delivers after-school construction pre-apprenticeship training at Cal Burke High School in Panorama City, introducing juniors and seniors to career opportunities in the skilled trades and construction industry.

PVJOBS was also awarded the Right Turn 3.0 initiative through a pass-through grant partnership with the Institute for Educational Leadership (IEL), funded by the U.S. Department of Labor Growth Opportunities Grant. In addition, PVJOBS received the RAMP Mentoring program award, further expanding supportive services, mentoring, and workforce development opportunities for young adults facing barriers to employment.



EXPANDING SECOND CHANCES THROUGH JUSTICE-INVOLVED YOUTH PROGRAMS

In 2024, PVJOBS strengthened its commitment to serving justice-involved youth through a new partnership with the Los Angeles County Probation Department. Through this initiative, the organization provides construction pre-apprenticeship training at Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall and Camp Kilpatrick.

The program introduces participants to career pathways in the construction industry while providing workforce readiness training, industry certifications, mentoring, and supportive services. By bringing training directly into juvenile facilities, PVJOBS creates opportunities for youth to develop employable skills and prepare for successful reentry into their communities. This work reflects the organization's long-standing belief that every individual deserves access to meaningful employment opportunities and a pathway toward self-sufficiency, regardless of past challenges or circumstances.

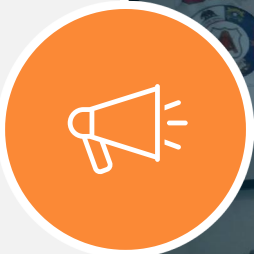
PVJOBS continued to position itself for long-term growth and innovation by securing a \$400,000 California RISE grant to support the development of social enterprise opportunities. The funding will help strengthen organizational sustainability while creating new opportunities for participant training and employment.

The organization also received a significant investment in environmental infrastructure after being selected through a partnership between Tesla and the City of Los Angeles to install eight electric vehicle charging stations at its 4112 South Main Street headquarters. This project enhances community access to clean energy resources while supporting broader sustainability goals for South Los Angeles. Additionally, First Street Bank executive Eli Hanaian joined the PVJOBS Board of Directors in 2024, bringing valuable expertise and leadership that will help guide the organization's future growth and strategic initiatives.
